

aimer

to like, to love

Present tense

AIMER is a regular –er verb. In order to conjugate all regular –er verbs, first, separate the root from the ending. The ending being –er, what's left – the root – is *aim*–. Now replace the –er infinitive ending with the following conjugated endings for the present tense.

pronoun	root	ending	English
j'	aim	e	I love/like
tu	aim	es	you love/like
elle	aim	e	she loves/likes
il	aim	e	he/it loves/likes
on	aim	e	we love/like
nous	aim	ons	we love/like
vous	aim	ez	you love/like
ils	aim	ent	they love/like
elles	aim	ent	they love/like

In context

I love Paris.

→ J'aime Paris.

AIMER + NOUN

We like cheese.

→ Nous aimons le fromage.

→ On aime le fromage. [more colloquial]

AIMER + VERBE

We like to travel.

→ Nous aimons voyager.

→ On aime voyager. [more colloquial]
