to have  
present tense

AVOIR is an irregular verb in the present tense.

| pronoun | conjugation | English   |
|---------|-------------|-----------|
| j'      | ai          | I have    |
| tu      | as          | you have  |
| elle    | a           | she has   |
| il      | a           | he/it has |
| on      | a           | we have   |
| nous    | avons       | we have   |
| vous    | avez        | you have  |
| ils     | ont         | they have |
| elles   | ont         | they have |

**In context**

I have a big house.  
→ J'ai une grande maison.

We don't have any red wine.  
→ Nous n'avons pas de vin rouge.  
→ On n'a pas de vin rouge. [more colloquial]

**Rappel:** **je** = I; **tu** = you [singular and informal]; **elle** = she; **il** = he or it, **on** = we [spoken everyday French], **nous** = we [more formal than "on"]; **vous** = you [plural and/or formal]; **ils** = they [masculine]; **elles** = they [feminine]
