to dry*

present tense

Some French verbs change their spelling as you conjugate them, especially in the **nous** and **vous** forms. This is one of them. The spelling change is on the accent.

*sécher also means "to cut, to ditch" in colloquial French

pronoun	conjugation	English
je	sèche	I dry
tu	sèches	you dry
elle	sèche	she dries
il	sèche	he/it dries
on	sèche	we dry
nous	séchons	we dry
vous	séchez	you dry
ils	sèchent	they dry
elles	sèchent	they dry

In context

I'm drying the dishes before.

→ Je sèche la vaisselle d'abord.

We are cutting class right now.

→ Nous séchons les cours là.

→ On sèche les cours là. [more colloquial]

Rappel: **je** = I; **tu** = you [singular and informal]; **elle** = she; **il** = he or it, **on** = we [spoken everyday French], **nous** = we [more formal than "on"]; **vous** = you [plural and/or formal]; **ils** = they [masculine]; **elles** = they [feminine]
